Because of this accelerator, Chrysalis Center has successfully expanded our La Cocina Culinary Arts Training program while developing job training skills for individuals, as well as offering event space through the TCC (Training & Conference Center). These programs have resulted in generating revenue to help support Chrysalis Center's mission.

This three-year program began in October 2018 when the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving's Nonprofit Support Program (NSP) launched the Social Enterprise Accelerator, designed to help

organizations expand beyond traditional grants and donations by generating additional revenue through social enterprise: selling a product or service that complements their mission and supports the financial sustainability of the organization. Of the 49 agencies that began the program, 38 completed the workshop series, 32 applied and 10 were accepted for additional business plan development, implementation support and fundraising coaching through October 2021. In 2022 a second cohort of six was chosen to engage in the process.

The Social Enterprise Accelerator is provided in partnership with No Margin, No Mission, a national consulting firm dedicated to helping nonprofits increase their earned income and entrepreneurial capacity.

Client Spotlight—Meet Mark



Mark joined the Community Transitional Services (CTS) Program at Chrysalis Center in July of 2022. Mark was released directly from incarceration to the CTS program, where he met Case Manager, Sasha Powell. Mark was incarcerated for 10 years and being away from the outside world greatly affected his mental health.

After moving into his new apartment, Mark had some medical concerns, and he needed to find the necessary medication as soon as possible. Sasha stepped in by showing him how to get to and from the pharmacy and local shops in his area.

Mark began to get acquainted with life after incarceration and regaining his independence, and Sasha assisted him every step of the way by helping him prioritize his tasks and find stable employment at Crown Market. Mark expressed how grateful he was to find a job he likes that pays him well. He feels like he can finally start living the life he envisioned.

Mark has come a long way and while he has hit a few bumps in the road, he never quit or gave up on himself. Mark hopes to one day become a licensed painter and be his own boss. He continues to receive support from Chrysalis Center, his son, and a few friends he has made in the community. During a recent case management session, Mark credited Sasha for helping him see his potential, and transform his life in just a few short months.


